Roman Catholic - the Roman Catholic Church of the Immaculate Conception is in the centre of the village. It is maintained by the Peter Middleton trust and falls within the Parish of St Joseph's, Wetherby whose Parish priest says Holy Mass regularly in the

church. The Church is open every day of the year for private prayer and all are welcome.

Village Hall

Built in 1952, the Village Hall has played a leading role in village life for over 60 years. In 2014 extensive improvements were carried out, creating a bright and airy hall, new toilets, new heating and lighting systems and a lovely terrace opening on to an attractive garden. To meet the cost of the works, over £70,000 was raised through grant aid from Biffa and the Parish Council, many fund raising events and generous donations from local residents and businesses. The hall is home to the village play group, yoga classes and a range of social events such as ballroom dancing, Christmas wreath making and the local school's plays to name but a few. It offers an attractive and inexpensive venue for children's and family parties, social and charity events and wedding receptions.

Public Transport

Unfortunately, the village is not well served by public transport.

BUS SERVICES

During term time, a school bus to Harrogate (which also accepts fare paying passengers) passes through the village at 7.50am returning at 4.15pm.

A demand-responsive service is also available, however it must be pre-booked by telephoning 0845 872 5282 between 10.00am and 12 noon Monday to Friday. This service travels to Wetherby on Thursdays, arriving in Wetherby at 11.20am and departing at 1.00pm. The same service travels to Harrogate on Fridays, arriving in the town centre at 11.15am and departing at 1.15pm. For more information on this demand-responsive service, please visit

TRAIN SERVICES

The nearest railway station is at Pannal about 5 miles way with trains running to Leeds, Harrogate and York. For main line trains, York and Leeds are on the East Coast line and there are through trains from Harrogate to London at select times.
